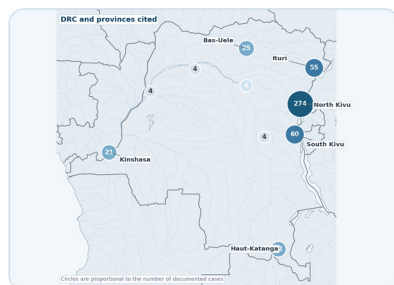

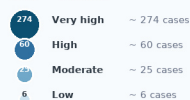
Geographic distribution - map

Physical integrity 156

Violations of physical integrity and the right to life remained highly prevalent, in a context of attacks against civilians and persistent accountability gaps.

South Kivu 60 15%

886 civilians affected in conflict-affected provinces including 256 victims of summary executions

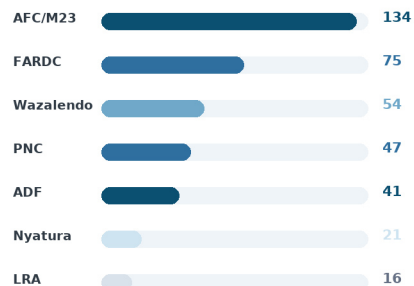
Geographic summary

393 cases in conflict-affected provinces - 88 cases in non-conflict provinces

North Kivu: 274 cases, the main documented hotspot

Conflict-affected provinces: 82% of documented cases

Main alleged perpetrators



Armed groups dominated in conflict areas; FARDC and PNC appeared across all provinces.

Conflict-related sexual violence

59 victims

40 documented cases

- Women: 33
- Girls: 25
- Man: 1

North Kivu: 73%

State actors: 46%

FARDC: 26 victims - M23: 14

Persistent needs: information, medical/legal care and availability of PEP/PEP kits.

Civic space

6 violations/abuses linked to civic space

22 victims, including 20 women

Most affected non-conflict provinces

Bas-Uele: 25

Haut-Katanga: 22

Kinshasa: 21

Risks: arbitrary arrests, illegal detention, threats, intimidation and restrictions on freedom of expression.

- 29 May Incident against a medical team in Mahagi
