



OLD BUT STILL WORKING






unsere Kameraden auf dem Foto demonstrieren.





"Tiernapojat", star-boys or star-bearers, is a very old traditional Finnish Christmas play. It was originally played by poor students who used it as a means to finance their studies. Since then it has been a tradition in the whole of Finland. "Tiernapojat" is a story of the birth of Jesus Christ and the happenings connected with it. In the picture in the centre King Herod is seen declaring the death sentence to the new-born King of Judea. Many familiar faces from HQ UNFICYP and the Finnish Battalion were seen in the play, which was performed at Fincon's pre-Christmas gatherings.



TO ALL MILITARY AND CIVILIAN MEMBERS OF THE UNITED NATIONS FORCE IN CYPRUS

I hand over command of UNFICYP today, the 18th December 1976, after a long and eventful tenure of seven years with the United Nations in Cyprus. During this period, in addition to sensitivity and incidents from time to time, there have unfortunately been grave and tragic developments on the Island. In spite of this, UNFICYP has at all times and on occasions under the most difficult conditions endeavoured to carry out its role and functions to prevent intercommunal conflict and destruction of life and property, to the best of its ability. An essential requirement in recent years has been the stabilisation and consolidation of the situation in the Buffer Zone after the operations in the summer of 1974. The success of your efforts, and those of our colleagues in the past, together with the steady, balanced and impartial manner in which you have tackled many a difficult and delicate situation has been well and appropriately reflected in the Secretary-General's reports covering each mandate. I should like to say today that I consider myself greatly privileged and honoured at having been given this unique opportunity of commanding such a splendid team of multi-national peace-keepers, who have contributed much to the cause of peace in such a dedicated, devoted and effective manner.

We have the good fortune of having seven military and three police contingents from Australia, Austria, Canada, Denmark, Finland, Ireland, Sweden and the United Kingdom in UNFICYP and, perhaps, the most encouraging feature of our functioning has been how well they have integrated to form a well-balanced, hard-working, effective and happy team. I thank you and your time-honoured countries most warmly for all you have done for UNFICYP, and I should like you to know that I am proud of having served with you.

We have been singularly fortunate in having the fullest support, assistance and guidance from the Secretary-General, Dr K. Waldheim, and his Under-Secretaries-General, Dr R. Guyer and Mr B. Urquhart, as well as their staffs and colleagues at UN Headquarters, which made our task so much easier. This was all

the more needed during the summer of 1974, and we are deeply grateful for the extent to which we have been supported in so full a measure all along.

I wish to pay a special personal tribute also to the memory of the Secretary-General and his Under-Secretaries General who were there when I joined UNFICYP, the late U Thant, the late Dr R. Bunche and the late Dr J. Rolz-Bennett, with my deepest gratitude for their most generous support.



The peace-makers and peacekeepers in UNFICYP have always worked closely together and indeed they complement each other. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General, Ambassador J. Perez de Cuellar, and the Senior Political Adviser, Dr R. Gorge, on two separate assignments, have made every effort to assist us in our peace-keeping efforts, and we have relied much on their advice, assistance and support, and I should like to thank them and their predecessors, Mr L. Weckman-Munoz and Mr B. Osorio-Tafall, the previous Special Representatives, and Mr J. Miles, the previous Senior Political Adviser, for their valuable contribution and assistance. We owe much to the Chief Administrative Officer, Mr G. Dunn, and the members of the UN Secretariat for looking after the administrative and logistic needs of the Force, and the willing and cheerful manner in which all our requirements have been met has made all the difference. I am much obliged to him and his predecessors, Mr V. Mills, Mr G. Ryder, Mr S. Dharman and Mr Hausner.

I am deeply indebted to my immediate assistants on the


staff, Brigadier M. Tillotson, the Chief of Staff, Colonel J. de Chastelain, the Deputy Chief of Staff, and the Police Adviser, Assistant Commissioner J. Hamilton, together with their officers, NCO's and men working under them, for their excellent contribution in running such a happy and effective team, and for their advice and assistance. I also recall with gratitude the contribution by their predecessors, Brigadier General C. Beattie, Brigadier F. Henn and Brigadier General E. Leslie as the Chiefs of Staff; Colonel P. Chiswell, Colonel Thornton and Colonel Riddell-Webster as the Deputy Chiefs of Staff and Dr H. Wagner, Superintendent Davidson and Superintendent McAulay as the Police Advisers. I have owed them all much over the years.

Major-General J. Quinn takes

over from me and in welcoming him to Cyprus I should like to wish him every success in achieving the tasks which lie ahead. I am confident that you will give him the same loyalty, trust and confidence which you extended to me in so generous a measure, in carrying out the mandate of the Security Council and the directives of the Secretary-General towards the peace and prosperity of Cyprus and its good people, who have given us much with their confidence, consideration, utmost kindness and generous hospitality.

We are close to the festive season, and in taking my leave, may I take this opportunity of wishing you and your families, from my wife and myself, a Merry Christmas and a Very Happy New Year.
