





World Health Organisation Expert Visits UNFICYP

Last week all Contingent Medical Officers and a number of senior Staff Officers were invited to the Austrian Field Hospital to listen to a talk by Dr Cvjetanoic of the World Health Organisation, who is an acknowledged authority on the disease of Cholera. Dr Cvjetanoic's visit was organised by the Chief Medical Officer Colonel E.D.H. Williams.

He spoke of the growing anxiety by governments to prevent the spread of the disease from the Middle East,

and he outlined the preventive measures and assistance that UNFICYP could be called upon to give in the event of the disease reaching Cyprus. He emphasised that cholera thrives in areas where sanitation and water supplies are poor, and that though governments may embark on mass vaccination programmes, the inoculation itself is no long term protector. A high standard of personal hygiene and strict camp discipline are the surest ways of avoiding infection.


MEDAL PARADE AT XEROS














LESSON ON THE FIRE PUMP















