


## CHEQUES IN AID OF LIMASSOL DISASTER FUND






### PIONEERS BUILD SAILING DINGHY

## BRITCON MEDAL PARADE



65 Sqn RCT played their first game of hockey on the island against the Lillywhites, a ladies team from RAF Nicosia.


65 Sqn won the game by 8-0.





Full praise goes to the Hackles although up against a more experienced team, played good football right up to the final whistle.




## FORCE COMMANDER VISITS AFH

The Force Commander Major General D. Prem Chand recently paid a visit to the Austrian Field hospital.


During this visit, he was shown round the Operating theatre by members of the staff of the hospital. (Picture above).
